Sorption and diffusion of moisture in hygroscopic materials are the key parameters influencing latent heat recovery capability. Their appraisal methods are provided and implemented. Besides materials side intensification, air side intensification measures are taken as well. Plate-fin and cross corrugated triangular ducts are two important structures that are introduced. Plate-fin is compact and mechanically strong. Cross-corrugated triangular ducts are a new type of primary surface heat mass exchanger. The basic transport data in these structures are provided. Convective heat and mass transfer coefficients in plate-fin ducts of finite fin conductance with various cross sections are numerical obtained. Fluid flow and heat transfer in cross-corrugated triangular ducts are estimated by considering laminar, transitional, and turbulent complex flow regimes. Based on the fundamental heat mass transfer data, the book illustrates some examples of the applications of total heat recovery in novel HVAC systems. Chilled-ceiling combined with desiccant cooling and independent air dehumidification are two pioneering trends in air conditioning industry.
