Shakespeare's Reading Apr 09 2021 Oxford Shakespeare Topics (General Editors Peter Holland and Stanley Wells) provide students, teachers, and interested readers with short books on important

aspects of Shakespeare criticism and scholarship, including some general anthologies relating to Shakespeare. *Shakespeare's Reading* explores Shakespeare's marvelous reshaping of sources into new creations. Beginning with a discussion of how and what Elizabethans read--manuscripts, popular pamphlets, and books--Robert S. Miola examines Shakespeare's use of specific texts such as Holinshed's *Chronicles*, Plutarch's *Lives*, and Chaucer's *The Canterbury Tales*. As well as reshaping other writers' work, Shakespeare transformed traditions--the inherited expectations, tropes, and strategies about character, action and genre. Shakespeare, Co-author Jan 18 2022 No issue in Shakespeare studies is more important than determining what he wrote. For over two centuries scholars have discussed the evidence that Shakespeare worked with co-authors on several plays, and have used a variety of methods to differentiate their contributions from his. In this wide-ranging study, Brian Vickers takes up and extends these discussions, presenting compelling evidence that Shakespeare wrote *Titus Andronicus* together with George Peele, *Timon of Athens* with Thomas Middleton, *Pericles* with George Wilkins, and *Henry VIII* and *The Two Noble Kinsmen* with John Fletcher. Synthesizing two centuries of discussion, Vickers reveals a solidly based scholarly tradition, building on and extending previous work, identifying the co-authors' contributions in increasing detail. The range and quantity of close verbal analysis brought together in *Shakespeare, Co-Author* present a compelling case to counter those 'conservators' of Shakespeare who maintain that he is the sole author of his plays.
